WILDLIFE TECHNICIAN JOB ANNOUNCEMENT

Jefferson Resource Company (JRC) is currently considering applicants for wildlife technician positions. JRC is a full-service natural resource consulting firm with several office locations in California.

Salary and Benefits : These are non-exempt positions ranging from \$16-35/hr based on education, experience and qualifications. Travel on the job is paid both ways and included overtime. Benefits include medical, dental, vision, life insurance, 10 holidays, vacation, and 401k with 4% employer match are available to regular full-time employees.

Travel: Must have personal transportation to and from assigned office. Work is typically scheduled Monday through Friday, with weekends off. Some projects may require out of town work.

Job Locations: We have openings for positions in Yreka and Mount Shasta, California.

Minimum Qualifications: These positions are entry level to mid-tier trainee positions suited for individuals looking to enter and/or advance their careers as resource professionals. Applicants will understand how to work in a professional setting with proper decorum, have a high degree of self-motivation, good organizational and decision making skills and a positive attitude. Applicants must have the ability to work safely and effectively in rugged terrain under adverse weather conditions and sometimes alone. Valid driver license and clean driving record required.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities: Assisting our Senior Wildlife Biologist with Northern spotted owl surveys and any other biological surveys required for timber sale preparation, administration and/or reforestation. This will include electronic broadcast surveys according to the established NSO protocols often on snow quads, four-wheelers, and/or trucks on logging roads often in remote locations. Employees must also take good field notes, enter data, identify bird species, and clear roads. Employees may also be presented with opportunities to assist with other duties including raptor surveys, amphibian surveys, vegetation (botanical) surveys, timber marking, timber inventory, sale layout, reforestation, and hazard tree inventories.

Physical Demands: Primary functions require working at night, sufficient physical ability and mobility to work in a field environment; to walk, stand, sit, and operate a snow quad, four-wheeler, and motor vehicle for prolonged periods of time; to frequently stoop, bend, kneel, crouch, run, crawl, climb, reach, twist, grasp and make repetitive hand movement in the performance of daily duties; carry, push and/or pull light to moderate amounts of weight (5 to 20 lbs.), including backpacks, equipment, and supplies; to operate assigned equipment and vehicles; ability to verbally communicate to exchange information with team members and public; ability to see and hear in normal range with or without correction; operate assigned field equipment.
